1. <u>MEMBERSHIP</u>: We had a decent increase of 366 members in November. However, there are still 546 members whose dues have expired, 38 expiring in November and 139 in December. - 3. **<u>DISASTER RELIEF</u>**: Per the North Carolina and Tennessee State Commanders, both are saturated with disaster relief supplies. Therefore, Posts who still have items accumulated for relief are encouraged to donate the collected items to a local non-profit organization, At the present time there are no plans for any trips to either state to deliver items.
- 4. <u>VFW PROGRAM DONATIONS</u>: We request Posts and Districts to donate \$275 to help offset the cost of the programs National mandates the State to participate in. Last year State HQS received \$9,765 in donations, but we spent \$14,417.54 on awards and recognition for the Patriot's Pen, Voice of Democracy, Teachers of the Year, Scout of the Year, JROTC and SROTC Cadet of the Year and Civil Air Patrol programs. We also made annual donations to the National VMS program, Gold Star Families and the National Home West Virginia House. To date, 37 of 70 Posts and 2 of 5 Districts have contributed to this year's programs. If you have not donated already, your donation is greatly appreciated and needed.

- 5. <u>VFW DAY OF SERVICE</u>: May 3, 2025 is the VFW Day of Service. Posts are required to sign up at https://todaysvfw.org/vfw-day-of-service/. More information to follow.
- 6. **2023 FEDERAL INCOME TAX FILING**: Filing deadline for all versions of 2023 Federal Tax Form 990 for most Posts and Districts is November 15th. Make sure your taxes are filed on time or an extension filed and a copy of proof of filing or the approved extension is sent to State HQS.
- 7. **PROOF OF INSURANCE AND TAX FILINGS**: Posts are required to forward a copy of the declaration page of Post property insurance (page with dates of coverage and amounts of coverage) and proof of 2023 tax filings to State Headquarters. *Districts are required to forward a copy of proof of 2023 tax filings*.
- 8. <u>SCHOLARSAPP WEBSITE FOR VOICE OF DEMOCRACY, PATRIOT'S PEN ENTRIES:</u> HQS is monitoring Voice of Democracy and Patriot's Pen entries submitted on the Scholarsapp website. Posts will be notified of an electronic entry and will be provided with a hard copy of the entry if required, to include a thumb drive of a Voice of Democracy essay.
- 9. <u>MID-WINTER CONFERENCE</u>: The Mid-Winter Conference will be held January 17-19, 2025, at Stonewall Resort, Roanoke, WV. Enclosed is an agenda, registration and hotel reservation information.
- 10. <u>ACTION CORPS</u>: To all who support the veterans' community, we need you to help us advocate for veterans benefits our Congressional members will not support. We need to add your voice to ours to get these Bills through the House and the Senate. By signing up to Action Corps, you will receive Action Alerts to respond directly to your Congressional members with just a couple of clicks. Go to www.vfw.org/JoinActionCorps, text "VFW" to 50457, or click on the QR code in the attached information to sign up for Action Corps. Remember, veterans need to take care of veterans.
- 11. <u>DASHBOARD ENTRIES</u>: Posts are reminded to enter their Voice of Democracy and Patriot's Pen participation in the Dashboard. Also when entering community service, utilize the calendar icon to the far right of the Entry Date box to enter the specific date the community service was completed. The system will not recognize a date placed in the Notes Field. Districts are to enter the totals of Patriot's Pen and Voice of Democracy information also. There is no reason entries are entered by mid-December.
- 12. **CHAPLAINS CORNER**: As we wrap up November and go into December, both months remind us to be thankful for what we have as we transition from Thanksgiving into the Christmas holiday season, so let us focus on being thankful this month!


1. Travel and Shuttle Service
