

## Supportive Services for Veteran Families

The Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) Program will assist very low-income Veteran families with a range of supportive services designed to promote housing stability and prevent homelessness. The SSVF Program is funded by a grant from the US Department of Veterans Affairs.

## **Eligibility**

- Veteran must reside in the household
- Veteran discharge status that does not read dishonorable
- Household income below 50% of the American Median Income (AMI)

## **Housing Requirement**

- Currently residing in permanent housing and at risk of becoming homeless OR
- Currently homeless or recently exited permanent housing and are scheduled or able to become a resident of permanent housing within 90 days. For example, a veteran living in a shelter, on the street or in temporary housing with an apartment identified.

**Case Management Services:** Based on an initial assessment, case manage services may include assistance in obtaining VA or other public benefits, health care services, daily living services, personal financial planning services, transportation services, income support services, fiduciary and representative payee services, legal services, child care, and housing counseling services.

**Financial Assistance Services:** Temporary financial assistance may be available to eligible veterans including rental assistance, utility payments, security payments, moving costs, childcare and transportation expenses.
